Ageratum - radiant clusters of
fuzzy flowers provide some of the
truest blues you can find

Alyssum - distinctive drooping flowers
create a soft, frothy look in hanging baskets

Angelonia - salvia-like flower spires
studded with fascinating snapdragon-like flowers



Celosia - upright, feathery plumes
or twisted form blooming in all
the colors of a glowing sunset

Lantana - abundance of
brightly colored flowers all
summer are a magnet for
butterflies

Melampodium - profusion of
yellow daisy-shape blooms all
summer

Petunia - prolific, showy blooms grow in a bushy or trailing/waving
habit depending on variety

Portulaca - this succulent plant rewards gardeners with non-stop
color

Salvia - vibrant red or blue flower spikes on compact plants

Verbena - spreading plant ideal for cascading over walls, pots,
baskets, and window boxes

Vinca, flowering - tiny parasol-like flowers on glossy green leaves
tolerate a wide variety of conditions

Zinnia - large, cheery flowers are highly attractive to butterflies
