Plants for Shade

When selecting your plants for your landscape, it is important to consider the amount of light available during the growing season. While many plants adapt to varying light levels, others will struggle if placed with too much or too little sunlight. To determine your planting situation, make observations throughout the year and through the course of a day:

- * Full Sun: 6 or more hours of direct, unobstructed sunlight.
- * **Partial Sun:** 4 to 6 hours of direct sun, such as a very bright location with a high, diffused canopy of trees.
- * **Partial Shade:** 2 to 4 hours of direct sun, such as beneath a canopy of shade trees in summer.
- * **Full Shade:** Usually less than 2 hours of direct sun. Buildings and tree growth prevent anything but dappled light from reaching the ground.

There are many plants available for semi-shade and shady locations. Johnson's carries a large selection of them:
