## **Plants for Wet Areas**

One of the biggest challenges for the homeowner is poorly drained soil. Excessive moisture in the soil can suffocate plant roots as it displaces oxygen. Even though standing water is not present, poor drainage is often responsible for plants not thriving or even dying.

If you are not sure about your drainage, a simple test will give you an idea. Dig a hole about 1 foot deep and fill it with water. Time how long it takes the water to soak into the ground. If it takes 20-30 minutes, you have fairly good drainage. If the hole still has water an hour later, you have a drainage problem.

The first thing that should be addressed is to try to improve the growing conditions by creating raised beds, swales, and drainage lines to help divert excess water away from plants. Secondly, you can incorporate plants that are tolerant of varying degrees of wet conditions.
